RECOGNIZING THE SIGNS OF GANG INVOLVEMENT

The reason youth join gangs are varied and complex. Being able to recognize the warning signs of possible gang involvement is critical. Parents & other adults should look for any drastic changes in the youths' behavior, including:

- ⇒ Using a different style of language or dressing in gang affiliated clothing
- ⇒ Associating with a different group of friends
- ⇒ Desiring privacy & showing anti-social behaviors/ attitude
- ⇒ Acquiring new possessions without parent's knowledge or financial means
- ⇒ Obsession with one color of clothing or logo
- ⇒ Claiming gang affiliation
- ⇒ Uses or practices hand signs, drawings, markings, tattoos that affiliate with a specific gang
- ⇒ Physical injury when youth has no explanation or lies about the cause
